What does a trip actually cost?

This resource will breakdown a nightly rate per person on a trip. It could feel overwhelming to some, so here below are VERY generic prices to give you a ballpark if your budget matches the type of trip.

Air is very dependent on location so that's harder, but on average most people spend approximately \$500 per person to get to get to Mexico and \$600-\$900 to get to the Caribbean.

A week trip **for two** (without air) typically breaks down like:

Budget Mexico/Dominican \$2000-\$3000

Mid range Mexico/Dominican \$3000-\$5000

Higher range Mexico/Dominican \$4000-\$6000

Caribbean Islands typically begin around the \$5000 price point for a more budget focused trip.

Mid range \$6000-\$8000

Higer range \$8000-\$10000

Luxury \$10000 and up.

The above are not during holiday travel times.

These numbers are simply to give you a starting point. I hope the more detailed numbers throughout this resource create a little more focused sample price for you!

Entry Level Resort



Entry Level Resort Elements

Vic's Thoughts

A entry level resort might look and feel like this:

- The bedding and quality of the room might seem a bit lower quality or dated.
- Expect lower esthetics and the focus to be very basic
- The overall visuals will be underwhelming at many (some newer options certainly defying this stereotype)

The Vibe of the resort is often very loud and energetic. When the price point is lower it becomes a choice that many social groups take that are focused on partying. I think this is the biggest warning when looking at an entry level resort is that the vibe and feel is very much out of your control as well as the resorts due to the nature of group mentality taking over the property. If you're traveling with children this is something to keep in mind. Adult spring break vibes and young children do not mix at an all inclusive resort.

Amenities would include (but not limited to)

- Some kids clubs- pending age of children typically 3/4 and up.

The service would be typically very basic. I wouldn't expect an overly attentive waitstaff at the pool or dining locations. I would expect a very tip forward sense of service (a staff to almost wait until they know you are planning to tip appropriately prior to engaging with you to the level of service you're looking for).

The food experience would be one that would leave you wanting more.

- A reservation system of morning made reservations for the same day or first come first serve.
- A buffet focused experience
- A la cart options with little variation.
- In general I would expect extremely low quality and abysmal presentation.

The beach would most likely not be very good for swimming.

Overall entry level resorts are not ones we focus on at Vic's Vacations simply because the quality is far beyond our control. **If the price point you are wishing to spend falls in this category it is always our suggestion to re-evaluate** the length of time of your trip (4 nights instead of 7), look at the date range and adjust to a more budget friendly time, or push the trip to a time where a mid range property would be practical. We are not condoning staying at this type of property, but we personally wouldn't feel comfortable booking this trip for ourselves or our closest friends... therefore we wouldn't feel comfortable booking you.

This is the reminder that we book the resorts we can stand behind. We are not a 1-800 number with a financial goal as our end goal. We are focused on creating memories with you for years to come.

Mid Range Resort



Mid Range Resort Elements

Vic's Thoughts

A Mid range resort might look and feel like this:

- The bedding and quality of the room will be a pretty significant jump from entry.
- Usually fairly large resorts
- The overall esthetics are across the board- Some are older while others are modern and new

The Vibe of the resorts vary drastically. Some are similar to entry level with a party focus (I mention this as many are family friendly options). Larger resorts bring options- multiple pools with different energies. In general we can match the energy of a resort to the client in this category a bit more.

Amenities would include (but not limited to)

- Spas become a bit more standard and while not a predominant experience they are there for your enjoyment!
- Kids camps with a bit more entertainment for children provided.

The service would be more client focused. Certainly not top tier, but absolutely appropriate.

The food experience would be

- Similar to entry level in some regards
- Still buffet focused
- Similar a la cart options
- Not a heavy push for elevated dining opportunities.

The beach can be hit or miss pending the resort/area you go to. Your agent will certainly help identify based on preference!

Overall mid range properties are where Vic's Vacations typically begins for budget conscious trips. We have a group of resorts in different destinations that we feel comfortable will remain in budget, while still focusing on the client experience. *It is important to keep in mind service, food and overall experience is not one size fits all and while some elements might seem sub par for one guest, they might be perfect for another.* Focusing on what your overall wish list for a property/trip is, allows us to hone in on the right resort for you. Also, the most important thing to note when booking these resorts is that *expectation has to meet reality.* **You cannot expect 5 star gourmet dining, butler service and pristine modern room accommodations at the price point that these resorts come in to.** As long as your expectations and wish list match the budget that links these resorts as options for you you will have a perfect vacation!

Mid Level Luxury Resort



Mid Level Luxury Resort Elements

Vic's Thoughts

A mid level luxury resort might look and feel like this:

- A focus on luxury in elements of the resort
- Renovations visible and appreciated (older resorts being modernized etc.)
- Esthetics become a part of this- with grand lobbies, great theming in restaurants, and unique experiences around the resort that tie into the overall feel of the property.
- The overall esthetics are a focal point of the resort and client experience is a large pillar of the resort.

The Vibe of the resort becomes much more clear at this price point. We have full confidence in the type of energy you'll experience. Calm/quiet-we've got it, loud/ fun- we've got it, full family focus- we've got it. *Mid level properties are where the majority of our budget focused clients tend to fall. After analyzing budget and creating a plan, **we'd always suggest fewer nights in this category than more in the entry or mid range.***

Amenities would include (but not limited to)

- Spa becomes a focus of the resort.
- kids camp and kid focus resorts. Resorts that thrive on elements for kids (family friendly ones of course)
- Inclusions of activities on property

The service would be very nice. Staff with a focus on engaging with you, not just serving you. Room service becomes much more standard at these resorts (I should say quality room service with good food).

The food experience would be

- A focal point.
- Buffets for breakfast being standard and optional for other times of day, but ample other options to stay away if you'd prefer.
- A la cart options become different and extremely enjoyable. Many with unique dining opportunities!

The beach varies based on location but we have a much more predictable resort set up with knowledge to advise you on beaches.

Overall, mid level luxury is just that. It provides glimpses of luxury at a more modest price. Mid level is where you'll see the majority of our budget forward vacations heading towards as we strive to express the value and differences of these properties over others. Whatever your wish list is, we can find a resort here!

Luxury Resort



Luxury Resort Elements

- Esthetics will be elevated, typically modern or updated, unique and provide an overall experience across the resort.
- The pride of the resort is the way it appears and feels to the client just as much as the way it serves the client.

The Vibe of the resort begins to truly feel luxury. From the turn down service to the presentation of the drinks at the pool- you'll note the difference in quality and appreciate the price point. We can certainly match the wish list of clients in here as far as activity level, but also as far as room wish list... want a private plunge pool? Want a Jacuzzi? Want your own rooftop? We have more access to those luxury amenities here.

Amenities would include (but not limited to)

- Wonderful spas
- Kids amenities at family resorts with a heavy focus on experiences and activities!
- Luxury food experiences (classes, demonstrations etc.)

The service would be a pillar. Engaging and thoughtful staff, client focused responses and much more. We never have to worry a client is going to return from one of these properties complaining about an experience with a staff member, or that they weren't the focal point of the trip.

The food experience would be

- A large component of the resort itself. Many resorts in this category have food and dining as their driving force.

Pricing for double occupancy of two adults is on average between \$800-\$1000 per person per night. Most high end luxury resorts are focused on adults.

The Vibe of the resort is often very calm and quiet. Often secluded. Focused on nature, intimacy and luxury.

Amenities would include (but not limited to)

- Rooms with views truly unmatched
- Spas that are world renowned or many in room treatments as the overall pick of clients
- Michelin star dining opportunities where applicable or superb experiences where not.

The service would be pristine. A client at an exclusive luxury resort won't worry about a thing as their butler or the resort will handle it all. From arrival, to service at the pool, turn down you name it- luxury and exclusivity will be the feel.

The food experience would be

- Superb. Many of these properties have Michelin dining experiences. If not, their dining will be memorable for years to come

The beach would most likely be the focal point of the resort matched only by the views.

Overall these resorts are for luxury centered clients. Clients who are not focused on a price tag when they travel, and looking for experiences that are unique and intimate.

Maldives/overwater bungalow inquiries. We get these often and it's imperative to think of a few details prior to this type of trip. Not only price point, but what the experience would feel like and the travel time invested. This [resource](#) is a great starting point for those inquiries.

Europe Sample Pricing



Europe Sample

This one is a bit harder. Please email us for a true conversation of Europe pricing. The variations here are simply so wide. I can't stress how different areas price: Florence prices vary from Positano, Venice prices differ from those in Capri. What are your expectations for hotels? We need to know what locations you envision, when you wish to travel, the style of travel expectations you have and of course length of trip.

BALLPARK numbers. A trip to Italy for a week for example on the low end would be \$6-8k without air. Most of our clients opt for a trip that's 10 days that range on the low end is typically \$8-10k. Looking for a luxury trip for 10 days we're starting around \$15k and going up from there.

We have sample pricing resources for multiple European destinations and are happy to share those with you, but qualifying your wants is pretty important.

We love doing trips to Europe, but want it to be YOUR trip.

Suggestions to Maximize Budget



A few notes on how to maximize your budget

First, remember- it's important to think about what you're able and willing to spend. That is a very different idea than what you want to spend. Sure, I'd love to spend 2k, but if that trip I want is a 5k trip then I either need to modify my budget or modify my trip elements.

Some suggestions if your budget is under the desired type of trip:

- Modify time of year. Rather than a trip over Christmas break, think of fall break. As you can see, fall pricing is much lower than winter.
- Change the length of your trip. A vacation doesn't have to be a full week. 5 nights is often plenty and a great modification to support budget. 4 nights is the minimum we'd suggest on a trip any less and it will feel rushed.
- Change location. You might not have a Caribbean budget and that's okay!
- Do you have miles/points from work or your credit card to help with flights?
- Modify airport. A major airport will always have cheaper pricing than a smaller one. If you live in Indiana, consider driving and flying out of Chicago vs Indiana. VERY important to account for gas, parking and even a hotel stay if needed but with large families this is often a way to save quite a bit.

Hurricane Season Pricing



Hurricane Season Warning

If you are planning to travel during hurricane season (Beginning of June through end of November) here are some notes. I know that's a long range, but it's a warning that it's a possibility. Typically hurricanes are more prominent August-October.

Before traveling here are a few things to note:

- Pricing is lower
- It will probably rain a little (Liquid sunshine is never a bad thing- I promise... just pack a baseball hat and an insulated cup with a lid and plan to have a drink with the rain falling around you) rain typically leaves as fast as it came in.

- Your forecast leading into your trip will look MUCH WORSE than it will actually be- my advice, don't pay any attention to it unless a named storm is in the forecast.
- Trust in resorts. While resorts would rather not be hit with a tropical storm/hurricane, they are prepared for them. The policies in places for storms are practiced and perfected by resorts.

The reality is rain is the bigger threat than a storm. Your safety and trip's success is ultimately our main priority. Should you have fears and concerns leading into a trip we're here to help you through them.

Will it rain, probably. Will that ruin your trip... nope.

How to Price Air



Pricing Air

[This video](#) details suggestions on how to book air on your own. International travel has a few differences from domestic so the layover times are very important (especially on the return).

The biggest things:

1. Use [Google Flights](#) to compare pricing
2. Compare that pricing to Southwest
3. DO NOT pick basic economy
4. Please stay away from Spirit, Frontier, Allegiant at all costs.
5. Morning flights into destination are more likely to get you there on time than afternoon ones.
6. Layovers- the departure 1 hour or longer and the return 3 hours.

LET THIS BE YOUR WARNING... PLEASE DO NOT BOOK AIR THROUGH A THIRD PARTY such as Expedia, Priceline etc. **We only advise to book directly with airlines** to ensure you have full flexibility should delays or cancellations happen. The small savings you could get is not worth the unknown of how you will navigate a travel day that goes south.

Extras (Insurance and Transfers)



Transfers

Transfers have varying price points. Often when booking with a travel agent these become included in the price (or the savings we get you on your bundled vacation package reduces the price enough to fully cover these and more!)

Pricing varies based on location and distance from the airport but I'd say ballpark price *per person* would be:

Shared transfers- stop at multiple hotels along the way and share with other travelers \$40

Nonstop shared transfers- go directly to your hotel without any stops sharing the transfer with other travelers \$60

Private transfer- just you and your travel companion(s) in a transfer directly to the resort. \$80

Luxury private transfers- above but in a luxury SUV (Suburban, Navigator etc.) \$100-\$140



Insurance

Depending on the type of insurance, price of the trip and supplier used to book insurance this is a varying scale.

I would say if you go for a credit back insurance policy- meaning if you cancel your trip for any reason you get a travel credit less the cost of insurance, we're at typically \$100 per person.

A cash back policy where you cancel (up to the day prior to arrival) and get back all money less insurance is typically \$250 per person.

Other policies vary, but for estimating price point I'd say plan on \$100-\$250 based on the type of policy you'd go with!
